Our homestay families reflect the diversity of life in the United States. They are very carefully chosen and provide a welcoming, friendly, and safe environment. Homestay families provide a unique opportunity to build lasting relationships and learn about American lifestyle.

Living in a homestay allows our students to have an excellent opportunity, not only to learn about American lifestyle, but also to practice English with native speakers daily in real-life settings.

### ACADEMIC BENEFITS OF CISL HOMESTAY:

- Students will receive daily linguistic practice and social interaction with an American family.
- Students will experience authentic San Diego culture while practicing their fluency and pronunciation.
- Students will hone their listening skills while learning informal idioms and slang in context.

### ADDITIONAL DESCRIPTION/AMENITIES:

- Typical travel time to CISL San Diego is 30-45 minutes using public transportation.
- Private rooms include a bed with linens, a desk, and a lamp.
- Most CISL homestays have shared bathrooms, but a few with private bathrooms are available.
- Students have access to laundry machines and all homestays have free Wi-Fi.
- Students will eat meals with the homestay family (either breakfast and dinner or breakfast only).
- Families are visited by the CISL Homestay Coordinator to ensure they meet CISL requirements
