PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Pathway Program provides a transition from CISL's English courses to an American college or university so that students may obtain an associate's degree, bachelor's degree, master's degree, or PhD. With Pathway, students receive the academic guidance and advising necessary to easily navigate the complex processes of higher education.

REQUIREMENTS TO BEGIN STUDYING AT PARTNER COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY:

- Proof of completion of secondary school in home country (diploma and transcripts, both in English)
- Successful completion of CISL English for Academic Purposes (EAP) course (12 weeks)
- Payment of \$1,360 Administrative fee
- Completion of Pathway Program Application and Agreement form
- Payment of application fees to each college/university the student chooses

Please note: While there is no minimum level of English proficiency required to enter the Pathway Program, students must have (B2) level proficiency in English to enroll in the 12-week EAP course. The selected college or university will determine whether a student qualifies for admission to a school.

There is a minimum level of English proficiency required to receive TOEFL/IELTS waivers – most schools require students to be Level 7(B2)+ and one or two schools require Level 9 (C1)

- Access to CISL's Pathway Partners (including TOEFL/IELTS waivers from all partners)
- The guidance of CISL's University Admissions Coordinator and the Admissions Department of the partner school, who answer all questions regarding the application and admissions processes.
- Conditional admission (acceptance letter from partner college/university upon completion of the required courses).
- An easy path to college acceptance: CISL's California Community Colleges partners provide guaranteed admission to a California State University campus for select bachelor's degrees.
- Achieve a high level of fluency and confidence
- Develop an in-depth understanding of American culture
- Become multi-cultural
- Be prepared for successful study in an U.S university
